As you know, for a number of years there has been a great deal of discussion about moving from paper to electronic records in both health and human services, locally, statewide and nationally. Our work in the Dayton community has informed and been informed by these discussions. The adoption of information technology is viewed as the primary method by which we can improve quality of care and reduce the cost of health care. Given the importance of this topic to our community, we would like to invite you to a meeting at the Kettering Center 140 E. Monument Ave. to have a more in depth discussion of these issues.

On December 1, 2006 from 9AM until noon, at 140 E. Monument Ave., there will be a Dayton area regional meeting to discuss health information technology, health information exchange and related privacy and security issues. During this meeting the Health Policy Institute of Ohio (HPIO) will present information on the Ohio Roadmap for health information technology and exchange. There will also be a brief presentation on the HealthLink Regional Health Information Organization in Dayton. HPIO will also describe the findings of the Health Information Security and Privacy Collaboration (HISPC) in Ohio. With the changes that are occurring in state leadership, this will be an important discussion.
